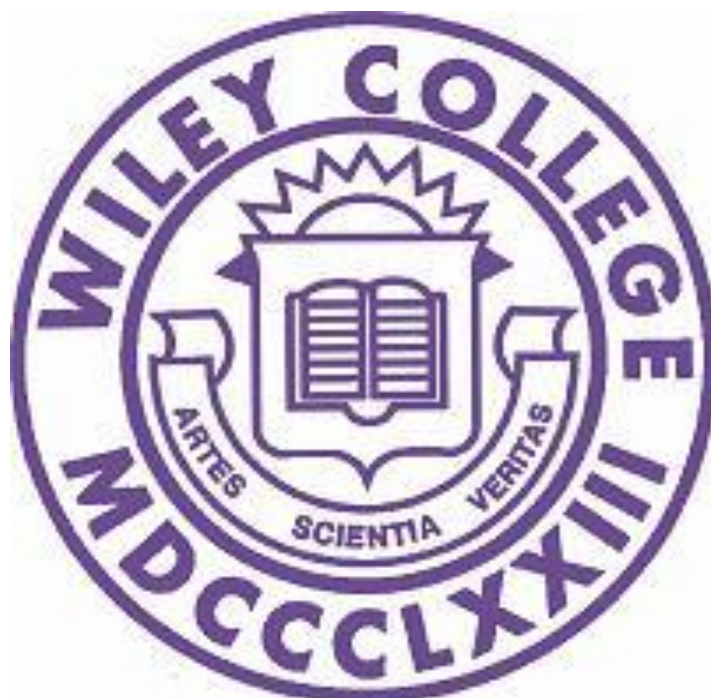

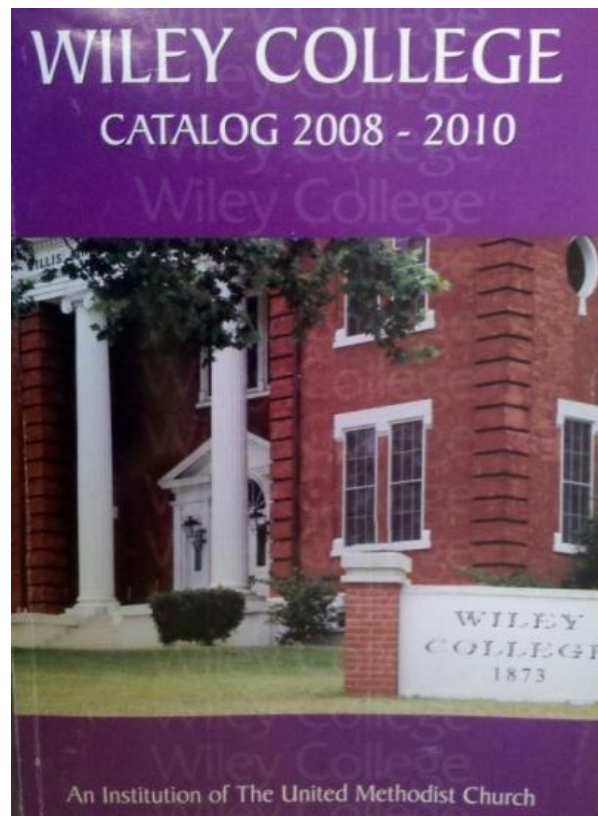

The proposed change is due to a vast number of degree plan requirements for those students enrolled between the years of 2006-2010. There were changes in the degree requirements between the 2006-2008 and the 2008-2010 academic catalogs. Because the 2008-2010 catalog was late, students who enrolled in 2008 and who should have been advised using the 2008-2010 catalog, were actually advised using the 2006-2008 catalog. When the 2008-2010 catalog was available, students were switched to their appropriate year which created discrepancies. A modified degree plan has been devised in order to combine the array of courses that can be used toward completion of graduation requirements during the 2006-2010 time frame. The modified degree plan covers the overlap between the 2006-2008 degree plan and the 2008-2010 plan. The revised plan is titled 2007-2008 degree plan and it captures students who were completing requirements under both the 2006-2008 & 2008-2010 plans. This method ensures the integrity of the degree and does not penalize students caught in the mixed curriculum. A copy of the approved document can be found in the Appendix of this document.

# Definitions for Headings on Degree Plans

## GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

All students aspiring to become candidates for the Bachelor of Arts, the Bachelor of Business Administration or the Bachelor of Science degrees in traditional programs must complete 53 semester credits of foundation courses in addition to those required for the major degree program and an optional minor. The underlying objective of the General Education curriculum is to provide students with the skills and knowledge, known as competencies, which can be demonstrated. The competencies serve as benchmarks of achievement and proficiency needed to succeed, not only in college, but also as life-long learners able to meet the general demands of society.

## DEPARTMENTAL REQUIREMENTS

A department represents both the physical and the academic place where a major and its faculty are housed (e.g., the Chemistry Department). A department may require its majors to earn certain courses outside its discipline (e.g., the chemistry major must take certain mathematics courses). At Wiley, program requirements is a generic term that has been used interchangeably with departmental requirements. Moreover, the term directed electives has also been used to refer to departmental requirements. In order to avoid confusion, the terms program requirements and directed electives will no longer be used and the term **departmental requirements** is now the accepted standard and will be used henceforth in all print media. **Departmental requirements** are courses required by a department or program, in addition to major courses not listed in other categories.

## MAJOR

A major consists of a minimum of thirty (30) semester hours of credit contained in a prescribed set of courses in one of the degree (major) fields of study offered by Wiley College. These are the required courses that establish the major or concentration in each department.

## FREE ELECTIVES

The degree requirements for graduation from a major at Wiley College generally include 125 semester hours (range from 121 to 146). Each major sets the number of hours allocated among the following categories: (a) General Education Requirements, (b) Major Requirements, (c) Departmental Requirements, and (d) Free Electives. Free electives are the designation of courses that a student may choose from all courses offered in the catalog to complete the required total hours for graduation. These free electives are intended to broaden a student's interests and spectrum of knowledge and experience. When the general education courses are combined with those of the major or concentration, those prescribed by the department, and the free elective courses, they lead to the baccalaureate degree. This combination of four categories constitutes the courses students must choose to complete the required total hours for a degree.

Student may choose as a free elective any course listed in the catalog for which the student meets its pre-requisites.

### **MINOR**

A minor consists of between 18 to 24 semester credit hours in a secondary field of study usually seen as complementary to the major. The content of the minor is defined by the department housing that field of study.

## DEFINITIONS

### GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

The objective of the General Education curriculum is to provide students with the skills and knowledge (demonstrable competencies) needed to succeed, not only in college, but also as life-long learners able to meet the general demands of society.

The General Education requirements are the fifty-three (53) semester credit hours of foundation courses (liberal arts) that all students must complete in addition to those required to complete a major area of study and an optional minor.

## DEPARTMENTAL REQUIREMENTS

A department represents both the physical and the academic place where a major and its faculty are housed (e.g., the Chemistry Department). A department may require its majors to earn certain courses outside its discipline (e.g., the chemistry major must take certain mathematics courses). At Wiley, program requirements is a generic term that has been used interchangeably with departmental requirements. Moreover, the term directed electives has also been used to refer to departmental requirements. In order to avoid confusion, the terms program requirements and directed electives will no longer be used and the term **departmental requirements** is now the accepted standard and will be used henceforth in all print media. **Departmental requirements** are courses required by a department or program, in addition to major courses not listed in other categories.

## MAJOR

A major consist of a minimum of thirty (30) semester hours of credit contained in a prescribed set of courses in one of the degree (major) fields of study offered by Wiley College. These are the required courses that establish the major or concentration in each department.

## FREE ELECTIVES

The degree requirements for graduation from a major at Wiley College generally include 125 semester hours (range from 121 to 146). Each major sets the number of hours allocated among the following categories: (a) General Education Requirements, (b) Major Requirements, (c) Departmental Requirements, and (d) Free Electives. Free electives are the designation of courses that a student may choose from all courses offered in the catalog to complete the required total hours for graduation. These free electives are intended to broaden a student's interests and spectrum of knowledge and experience. When the general education courses are combined with those of the major or concentration, those prescribed by the department, and the free elective courses, they lead to the baccalaureate degree. This combination of four categories constitutes the courses students must choose to complete the required total hours for a degree.

Student may choose as a free elective any course listed in the catalog for which the student meets its pre-requisites.

## MINOR

A minor consist of between 18 to 24 semester credit hours in a secondary field of study usually seen as complementary to the major. The content of the minor is defined by the department housing that field of study.
